## Video: /T/ Pronunciation

If the penultimate sound in a verb, before the ED, is an unvoiced sound, then the pronunciation of the letters ED is /t/. These unvoiced sounds are: /p/, /t/, /k/, /f/, / $\theta$  /, /ʃ/, /s/ and / $\frac{1}{3}$ /.

Video: /D/ Pronunciation

If the penultimate sound in a verb, before the ED, is a voiced sound, then the pronunciation of the letters ED is /d/. These voiced sounds are: /b/, /d/, /n/, /m/, /j/, /ŋ/, /r/, /v/, /w/, /l/, /ð/, / $\frac{1}{3}$ / and /z/.

Video: /ID/ Pronunciation

If the penultimate sound is an exception sound, then the pronunciation of the letters ED is /id/. These exception sounds are: /t/ and /d/.
