



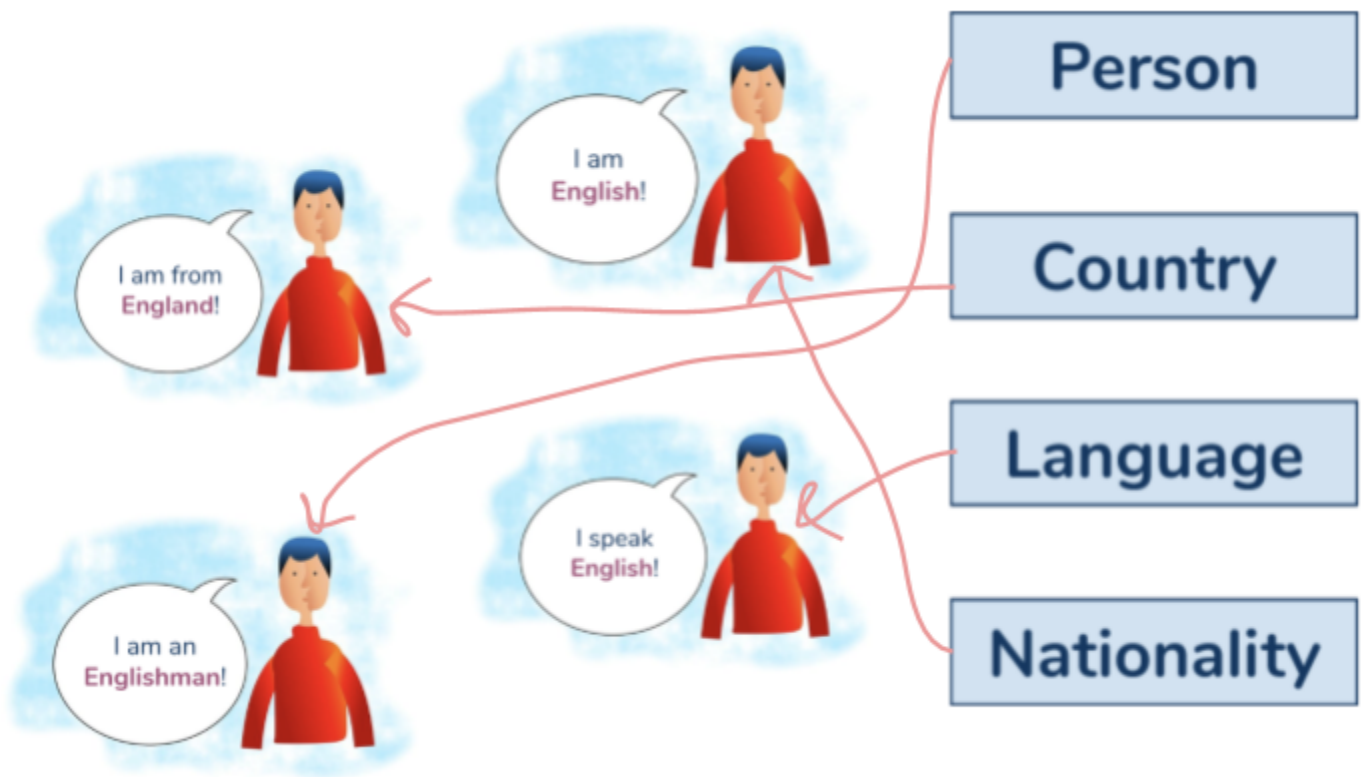
“Where do you come from?” Interactive Worksheet

EXERCISE A: Draw lines to match the responses to the type of response used.



EXERCISE B: Write three questions that are normally asked that require you to respond with your country.



- 1) Question 1: **Where do you come from?**
- 2) Question 2: **Where are you from?**
- 3) Question 3: **Which country are you from?**

EXERCISE C: If somebody asks the question “what is your nationality?”, what type of words do you need to respond? There are two possibilities.

What is your nationality?

I can respond to this question with the **nationality** or **person**.

What language do you speak?

Response: I speak Portuguese!

EXERCISE H: What is a person called who is from São Paulo?

A person from São Paulo is called a Paulistano.
