	Definite Article	Specific, previously mentioned or obvious distance between two things

	Definite Article	Specific, previously mentioned or obvious school

Video: Prison/Jail

EXERCISE G: Briefly explain why we use the article in each of the situations in the table. Write your answer in column 3.

Prison/Jail	Zero Article	To be a prisoner who has committed a crime and therefore is in prison
	Indefinite Article	To be a visitor at any random prison, with no particular reference to one prison
	Definite Article	To be a visitor at one specific, previously mentioned or obvious prison

EXERCISE H: Write “prison” correctly using either the definite article, indefinite article or zero article to complete the following sentences.

- 1) I work at **the prison** in town.
 - 2) He was sent to **prison** for robbery.
 - 3) I would love to see the inside of **a prison** to see what it's like.

Hospital	Zero Article	You're in the hospital because you're a patient and ill
	Indefinite Article	You're visiting a random, non-specific hospital
	Definite Article	You're visiting a specific, previously mentioned or obvious hospital

	Definite Article	<ul style="list-style-type: none">1. The university is a location and you're visiting it2. The name of the university

Bed	Zero Article	Staying for a prolonged period of time e.g. sleeping, resting or ill in bed
	Definite Article	Piece of furniture or location

EXERCISE P: Write “bed” correctly using either the definite article or zero article to complete the following sentences.

- 1) Shall we have breakfast in bed this morning?
- 2) I’m so tired, I’m going back to bed.
- 3) She was hiding under the bed.
- 4) I love the bed that you’ve bought.
- 5) I’m going to bed now. Night!



Video: Plural Groups

EXERCISE Q: Briefly explain why we use the article in each of the situations in the table. Write your answer in column 3.

Plural Groups	Definite Article	A specific, previously mentioned or obvious group
	Zero Article	A non-specific group used for general statements



Video: Titles

EXERCISE R: Fill in the gaps to complete the sentences below.

An alternative way of addressing people by their titles is by using the definite article, then the title with a lowercase letter.

- Dr Jones would be written as **the doctor**.
 - Reverend Owen would be written as **the reverend**.

EXERCISE S: Explain the differences between these three sentences.

- I'd like to have a dog: A **non-specific, random dog**
- I'm allergic to dogs: **Plural noun used for general statements, no specific dog**
- The dog next door is cute: **Specific dog that is known**
