Keyword	Use	Position	Example Sentence
Always		In between subject and verb <i>*Follows the rules of frequency adverbs</i>	<i>I always visit France.</i>
Every	Time phrase after every	Beginning or end of the sentence	<i>Every year, I go to Spain. I go to Spain every year.</i>
In	Time phrase after in	Beginning or end of the sentence	<i>In summer, I go on holiday. I go on holiday in summer.</i>
Normally		In between subject and verb <i>*Follows the rules of frequency adverbs</i>	<i>I normally go to dance class.</i>
Twice	A + time phrase after twice	Beginning or end of the sentence	<i>Twice a year, I see my father. I see my father twice a year</i>
Usually		In between subject and verb <i>*Follows the rules of frequency adverbs</i>	<i>I usually work in the mornings.</i>

Any longer	Anymore No longer		End of the sentence	We aren't learning English any longer

Constantly		Negative effect	Between the verb to be and present participle	He is constantly playing videogames
Forever		Negative effect	Between the verb to be and present participle	She is forever studying, so I don't see her much
Now	Even now		Beginning or end of the sentence	They are getting on the aeroplane now Now, they are getting on the aeroplane
