EXERCISE A

What is the difference between a voiced sound and an unvoiced sound?

A voiced sound means the vocal cords vibrate when you say the sound. For example /g/. An unvoiced sound is the opposite, the vocal cords don't vibrate. For example /s/.


EXERCISE D

What is a voice pair?

Two sounds (one voiced sound and one unvoiced sound) are paired together because everything is the same when you say these sounds. The face, cheeks, jaw and tongue are in the same position, but one sound is voiced and the other sound is unvoiced.
