



Play, Do and Go

Now you have reviewed some sports vocabulary,
let's analyse the verbs that are used with each
sport.

There are three sports verbs in English - **play**, **do**
and **go**.

Play tennis



Play basketball



Play baseball



Play football



Play hockey



What do all these sports have in common?



They all use a BALL in the sport and they are all competitive!



So, if the sport uses a ball and is competitive,
then we must use the verb **PLAY** with the sport.



Let's move on to the next verb, GO.

Go running



Go ice skating



Go roller skating



Go skateboarding



Go fishing



Go sailing



Go swimming



Go dancing



What do all these sports have in common?

Running
Ice skating
Roller skating
Skateboarding
Fishing
Sailing
Swimming
Dancing

They all end in the letters ING

Running

Ice skating

Roller skating

Skateboarding

Fishing

Sailing

Swimming

Dancing

So, if the sport ends in the letters **ING**, then we use the verb GO.

All the remaining sports (that usually have no equipment and are individual sports) use the verb DO.


Do karate
