



Demonstrative Adjectives

We learnt in the grammar explanation video that the words **this, that, these** and **those** are followed by a noun. This is true but it's not always immediately after the word. Let's take a look at some example sentences.



This cat is blue



This cat is blue

this

noun

(verb + adjective)

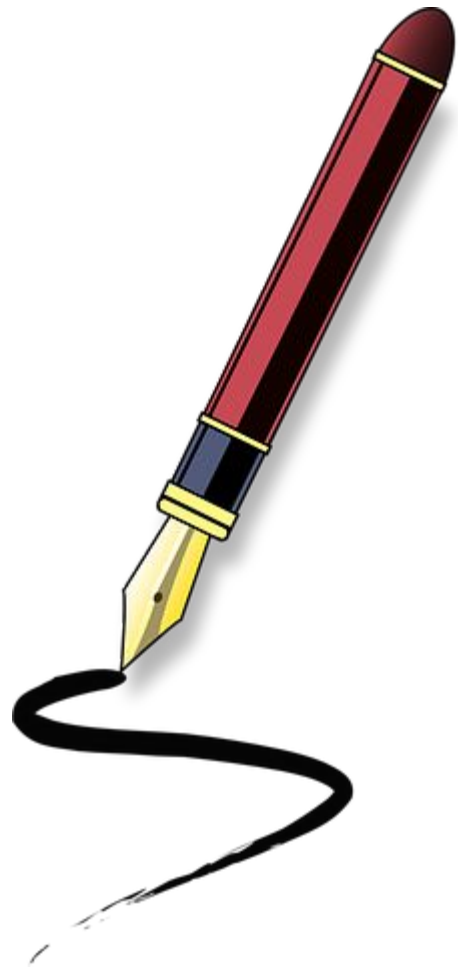
Some sentences use this structure

those

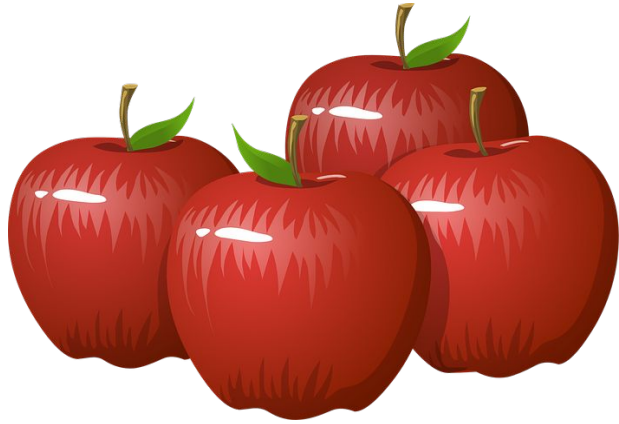
+ noun

That pen is black



These apples are red



Those pencils are black



This is a blue cat

Some sentences use this structure

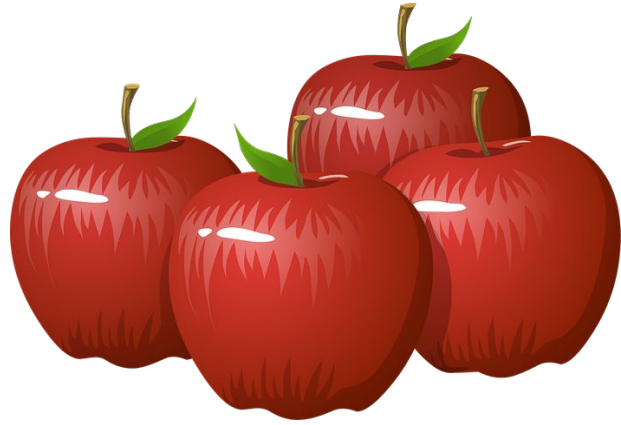
this

+ verb

+ noun
(sometimes an
adjective describes
the noun)



That is a black pen



These are red apples



Those are black pencils

You can choose which structure to use, but make sure you use the words in the correct order!
