

Demonstrative Adjectives



We learnt in the grammar explanation video that the words this, that, these and those are followed by a noun. This is true but it's not always immediately after the word. Let's take a look at some example sentences.






This cat is blue









Some sentences use this structure

this that these those

+ description


(verb + adjective)






That pen is black






These apples are red












Some sentences use this structure

this that these those


+ verb

+ noun
(sometimes an adjective describes the noun)




That is a black pen





These are red apples
