EXERCISE A: What is a countable noun?

A countable noun is: **a noun that we can count. A number can be inserted before this noun.**

EXERCISE B: Fill in the gaps to complete the sentence.

Countable nouns have two forms: the **singular** form and the **plural** form.

EXERCISE D: What is an uncountable noun?

An uncountable noun is: a noun that cannot be counted and separated into individual pieces.

EXERCISE F: Fill in the gap to complete the sentence.

EXERCISE F: Fill in the following table with information about the nouns “chicken”, and “toast” that can be both countable and uncountable. In the first column, you can see the noun. In the second column, you should write the meaning of that noun as a countable noun. In the third column, you should write an example sentence of that noun being used as a countable noun. In the fourth column, you should write the meaning of that noun as an uncountable noun and in the fifth column, you should write an example sentence of that noun being used as an uncountable noun.
