



## Clothes Interactive Worksheet

Watch the video about clothes in English and fill in the gaps with the missing words.

Hello everyone! I'm Hannah, an English teacher at Virtually Fluent. Today, we are going to learn clothes.

Most people store their clothes inside a wardrobe. This, behind me, is my wardrobe. Let's open it up and have a look at some items of clothing. Welcome to my wardrobe! You can see I have lots and lots of clothes here. Before we learn the clothing vocabulary, it's really important to know the verb to talk about clothes - to wear. I wear and then the item of clothing. So, let's get started with some clothing.

First of all, we're going to talk about **trousers**. Trousers are anything on the bottom part of your body. Let's take a look! These are trousers, they are things on the bottom part of my body. If the material is denim, like these here, then these are **jeans** instead. Trousers and jeans. Sometimes our trousers or jeans are very short. These have a different name, these are **shorts**. Here are my shorts.

But today I am not wearing trousers, I am wearing a **dress**. This is one long piece of material. Here is another example of a dress, one long piece of material. Next we have a **skirt**, which is similar to a dress, but it's only half the size. This is a skirt on the bottom part of my body. So, now, we've done everything on the bottom part of the body.

Let's look at the top part. Anything up here is a **top**. For example, this is a top. This has nice long arms, this is a top. If a top is very, very short and stops here, it has a different name. It is a **T-shirt**. This is a T-shirt. You can see the t-shirt stop here, here on my arm, a T-shirt. As you can see, the shape of this is a T.

Let's continue with some more types of tops. Next on the list is a **shirt**. A shirt is normally a little bit more formal. This is an example of a shirt. It has this collar at the top and normally there are buttons down the front and it normally has long arms too. This is a shirt. When it gets really cold in winter, we need to wear nice warm clothes. That is why we wear a **jumper** or in American English a sweater. This is normally very thick material, nice long arms, this is a jumper. Another piece of clothing I want to review today is this. This is a **jacket**. This is also more formal.

Now, let's move on to the feet. Anything we wear on our feet is a **shoe**. It can be a different shape, different size, different colour. Let's have a look! Like this, this is a shoe and this goes on my feet. A different type of shoe is a **boot** and this covers the entire foot at the top. Normally we wear these in winter when it's cold outside, boot. Underneath my shoes, sometimes I wear **socks**, which is a piece of material that goes on my foot.

Now let's move on to some accessories, starting with the head. Sometimes we wear a **hat**. Here I have some different hats, hat. We have lots of different types of hats. This is a very big sunhat. We also have something like this, which is a **cap**. A baseball cap. Another accessory is a bag. A bag is something you put on your shoulder and you take lots of equipment with you. In particular, we have a **handbag**. This is a handbag.

And another accessory is a **scarf**. This is a scarf and this keeps me nice and warm when it's cold in winter. With my scarf, sometimes I wear a **coat**. Normally this is when it is cold outside. This is a really big piece of clothing, this is a coat.

And the final accessory is **glasses**. These are special glasses because we wear these outside when it's sunny. These are sunglasses. But for your vision, to improve your vision, they're just normal glasses.

And that's it, that's all the basic clothing vocabulary in English.
