










## Directions Vocabulary

Vocabulary	Transcription	Definition	Image
roundabout	<b><u>raʊn</u></b> dəbaʊt	A big circle that vehicles move around in one direction.	
zebra crossing	<b><u>zɛ</u></b> brə <b><u>krɒs</u></b> ɪŋ	A part of the road that has white stripes. This is a safe place to walk across and the priority is given to people.	
traffic lights	<b><u>træf</u></b> ɪk laɪts	Three coloured lights (red, amber and green) that represent instructions. Red- stop the vehicle. Amber- prepare to move/ prepare to stop the vehicle. Green- move the vehicle.

signpost	<u>saɪn</u> pəʊst	An area that gives information about a place. For example, the name, the distance, the direction.	
motorway	<u>məʊtə</u> weɪ	A big road with lots of vehicles that connects to the big cities.	
one-way street	wʌn-weɪ stri:t	A road where vehicles can only travel in one direction.	
junction	<u>dʒʌŋk</u> ʃən	A road where you can choose more than one direction.
