

Eat and Drink



The verb "eat" means to consume food and put this inside your mouth.



If we talk about food in general, likes and dislikes and part of our daily routine, we use the present simple tense.



Present Simple Tense

Affirmative	Negative	Question
l eat	l don't eat	Do I eat?
You eat	You don't eat	Do you eat?
He eats	He doesn't eat	Does he eat?
She eats	She doesn't eat	Does she eat?
It eats	lt doesn't eat	Does it eat?
We eat	We don't eat	Do we eat?
They eat	They don't eat	Do they eat?



If we talk about food we are eating at the same time as speaking, we use the present continuous tense.



Present Continuous Tense

Affirmative	Negative	Question
I am eating	I'm not eating	Am I eating?
You are eating	You aren't eating	Are you eating?
He is eating	He isn't eating	Is he eating?
She is eating	She isn't eating	Is she eating?
It is eating	It isn't eating	Is it eating?
We are eating	We aren't eating	Are we eating?
They are eating	They aren't eating	Are they eating?



The verb "drink" means to consume liquid and put this inside your mouth.



If we talk about drink in general, likes and dislikes and part of our daily routine, we use the present simple tense.



Present Simple Tense

Affirmative	Negative	Question
l drink	l don't drink	Do I drink?
You drink	You don't drink	Do you drink?
He drinks	He doesn't drink	Does he drink?
She drinks	She doesn't drink	Does she drink?
It drinks	lt doesn't drink	Does it drink?
We drink	We don't drink	Do we drink?
They drink	They don't drink	Do they drink?



If we talk about a drink we are having at the same time as speaking, we use the present continuous tense.



Present Continuous Tense

Affirmative	Negative	Question
I am drinking	I'm not drinking	Am I drinking?
You are drinking	You aren't drinking	Are you drinking?
He is drinking	He isn't drinking	Is he drinking?
She is drinking	She isn't drinking	Is she drinking?
It is drinking	lt isn't drinking	ls it drinking?
We are drinking	We aren't drinking	Are we drinking?
They are drinking	They aren't drinking	Are they drinking?
