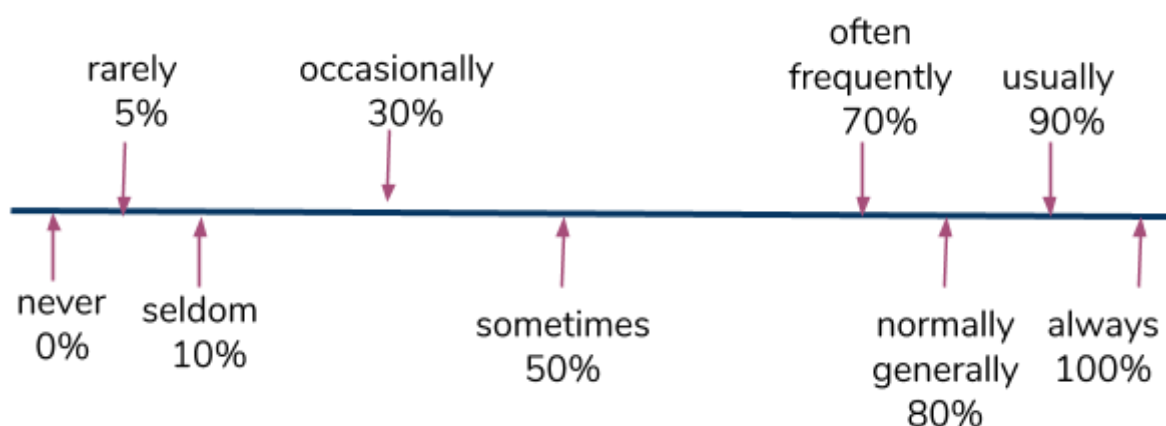


## Adverbs of Frequency

Adverbs of frequency tell us the number of times you complete something.



Adverbs of frequency are placed in very specific positions in a sentence.

Rule	Structure	Example
<b>Affirmative</b>	subject + FA + verb	<i>I always dance</i>
<b>Affirmative (long adverb)</b>	FA + subject + verb subject + verb + FA	<i>Three time a week, I dance</i> <i>I dance three times a week</i>
<b>Affirmative (to be)</b>	subject + be + FA + extra	<i>I am always dancing</i>
<b>Negative</b>	subject + neg + FA + extra	<i>He doesn't always work</i> <i>He isn't always working</i> <i>I am not usually happy</i>
<b>Question</b>	verb + subject + FA + extra	<i>Do you always smoke?</i> <i>Are you always smoking?</i>
