




What Is An Adjective?

Adjectives are **describing words**. They add extra information to a sentence to make it more exciting and more interesting.

Adjectives can go in two positions in English.




In front of a noun



I like **dark** chocolate



This is a red apple



Or after a linking verb

The chocolate is dark



This apple is red



A linking verb is a special type of verb in English. The most common examples are **to be**, **to seem** and **to look**, but there are hundreds of linking verbs. You simply need to learn if a verb is a linking verb.

Sometimes we use more than one adjective in a sentence. When this happens, the adjectives must go in a very specific order. Watch our video in the next activity to learn about this.
