



What Is The Comparative Form?

The comparative form is a special grammatical structure that is **applied to adjectives** in English.

If we want to **compare two nouns** using the same adjective, that's when we need the comparative form.

The typical sentence structure is

Noun
(Subject)

Verb

Comparative

THAN

After every comparative sentence in English **we must use the word THAN.**
This is an essential part of the comparative form.

For example

The elephant is bigger **than** the lion.
