

What Is The Comparative Form?



The comparative form is a special grammatical structure that is applied to adjectives in English.



If we want to compare two nouns using the same adjective, that's when we need the comparative form.



The typical sentence structure is

Noun (Subject)

Verb | Comparative | THAN



After every comparative sentence in English we must use the word THAN. This is an essential part of the comparative form.



For example

The elephant is bigger than the lion.
