ON





The preposition "in" is used in these situations

- 1) Years
- 2) Months
- 3) Decades
- 4) Centuries
- 5) Eras

- 6) Periods of time
- 7) Seasons
- 8) Times of the day



1) Years

I went to Spain in 2018.



2) Months

My birthday is in July.



3) Decades

I was born in the 80s.



4) Centuries

There were two world wars in the 1900s.



5) Eras

It was cold in The Ice Age.



6) Periods of Time

In 3 weeks, I will go to France.



7) Seasons

I will clean the garden in spring.



8) Times of the day

<u>In</u> the morning, I wake up and get dressed.



The preposition "on" is used in these situations

- 1) Days
- 2) Dates
- 3) 1 day specific event



1) Days

I have English class on Monday.



2) Dates

My birthday is on 25th September.



3) 1 day Specific Events

On Christmas Day I usually go for a walk.



The preposition "at" is used in these situations

- 1) Time
- 2) Specific time of day
- 3) Mealtimes
- 4) Holiday period (longer than 1 day)



1) Time

I have dinner at 7pm.



2) Specific time of day

<u>At midday I watch my favourite TV programme.</u>



3) Mealtimes

At lunch I normally do the ironing.



4) Holiday period

All my family get together <u>at</u> Christmas.



There are some exception time phrases that also use "at".

I read a book and watch TV <u>at</u> <u>night</u> before bed.
