

Present Simple v Present Continuous Forms



The present simple and the present continuous tenses have very different forms.

Let's review them.



AFFIRMATIVE

Present Simple	Present Continuous	
l walk	I am walking	
You walk	You are walking	
He walks	He is walking	
She walks	She is walking	
It walks	It is walking	
We walk	We are walking	
They walk	They are walking	



NEGATIVE

Present Simple	Present Continuous	
l don't walk	l'm not walking	
You don't walk	You aren't walking	
He doesn't walk	He isn't walking	
She doesn't walk	She isn't walking	
lt doesn't walk	lt isn't walking	
We don't walk	We aren't walking	
They don't walk	They aren't walking	



QUESTIONS

Present Simple	Present Continuous	
What do I cook?	What am I cooking?	
What do you cook?	What are you cooking?	
What does he cook?	What is he cooking?	
What does she cook?	What is she cooking?	
What does it cook?	What is it cooking?	
What do we cook?	What are we cooking?	
What do they cook?	What are they cooking?	



Be very careful with the verb "do" in question form because the meaning completely changes in the present simple tense.



WHAT DO YOU DO?

This means "what is your profession/job?"





WHAT ARE YOU DOING?

This means right now, which activity are you doing?
