### EXERCISE A

Fill in the table below to review the rules for adjectives that are one syllable.

| Adjective    | Rule  |
|--------------|---|
| <b>old</b>   | Add EST to the end of the adjective. Old → oldest   |
| <b>large</b> | Add ST to the end of the adjective when the final letter is E. large → largest                        |
| <b>big</b>   | Double the final consonant when the last three letters are consonant, vowel, consonant. Big → biggest |

### EXERCISE B

Fill in the table below to review the rules for adjectives that are three syllables.

| Adjective          | Rule  |
|--------------------|---|
| <b>comfortable</b> | Add “most” before the adjective. Comfortable → most comfortable |

### EXERCISE C

Fill in the table below to review the rules for adjectives that are two syllables.

| Adjective | Rule   |
|-----------|--|
| clever    | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Either add EST to the end of the adjective. Cleverest</li><li>• Or say “most” plus the adjective Most clever</li></ul> |
| happy     | Eliminate the Y and add IEST when the final letter is Y. Happy → happiest  |
| tired     | When the final letters are ED, FUL, ING, LESS, IVE, OUS use “most” plus the adjective.   |

### EXERCISE D

What are the following irregular adjectives in the superlative form?

| Adjective | Comparative       |
|-----------|-------------------|
| good      | best              |
| bad       | worst             |
| far       | farthest/furthest |
| many      | most              |
| little    | least             |
