

Present Simple v Present Continuous Common Mistakes



Let's take a look at the typical mistakes that English learners make in the present simple and present continuous tenses.





He's loving it!

Many English learners use the present continuous tense with stative verbs, but we should use the present simple tense instead.





He loves it!







We are don't play football

Many English learners want to use the verb "to be" too much. We only use the verb "to be" as an auxiliary verb in the present continuous tense.



We don't play football







I study French these days

English learners tend to use the present simple tense to talk about an action happening now in the present time, but processes should be in the present continuous tense.



I am studying French these days







The dog rests now

English learners want to use the present simple tense to talk about an action happening at the same time as speaking, but this should be the present continuous tense.



The dog is resting now
