

## Error Correction **Answers**

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Look at each sentence. They are all incorrect. Explain why the sentence is incorrect and write the correct sentence in the spaces provided.

- 1) There aren't no children in the park.

### EXPLANATION

When using any, we must use a negative verb. When using no, we must use an affirmative verb.

### CORRECT SENTENCE

There aren't any children in the park.  
There are no children in the park.

- 2) I can hear a noise! Is there anyone in the house?

### EXPLANATION

When we have insight into the answer, we should use "some" instead of "any".

### CORRECT SENTENCE

I can hear a noise! Is there anyone in the house?

- 3) There aren't some rabbits in the garden.

### EXPLANATION

When the verb is negative, we must use "any". "Some" isn't used with a negative verb.

### CORRECT SENTENCE

There aren't any rabbits in the garden.

4) She likes some type of tea.

**EXPLANATION**

**“Some” must be followed by plural or uncountable nouns.**

**CORRECT SENTENCE**

**She likes some types of tea.**

5) She goes to every classes

**EXPLANATION**

**“Every” must be followed by a singular noun.**

**CORRECT SENTENCE**

**She goes to every class.**

6) There is noone in the kitchen

**EXPLANATION**

**“No one” is the only indefinite pronoun compound written as two separate words.**

**CORRECT SENTENCE**

**There is no one in the kitchen.**

7) Are there some thing for me to eat?

**EXPLANATION**

**“Something” is a singular word, so the verb must be singular. In addition, this indefinite pronoun compound should be written as one word.**

**CORRECT SENTENCE**

**Is there something for me to eat?**
