Imperative Form

The imperative form is the most basic sentence structure.

USE

- To give commands or orders
- To give instructions
- To offer advice
- To warn somebody

STRUCTURE

Affirmative



Just the verb





Negative



Don't press the button!



Don't use subjects with this structure, you use the verb alone. It is implied that the imperative is directed to the person/people listening.



Therefore, it is the same for all people. If you are talking to one person, one boy, one girl or a group of people, it's always the same.



To sound more polite, you can add "please" after the imperative.
