Indefinite Articles

An **indefinite article** tells us that you are referring to one nonspecific item.

In most languages, indefinite articles depend on whether a noun is masculine or feminine, but in English we don't have masculine or feminine nouns, so we need a different rule to tell us which indefinite article to use.

There are two main indefinite articles in English: a and an.

We use "a" when the following word starts with a consonant



We use "an" when the following word starts with a vowel



But there are a few exceptions to these rules. For example: <u>a</u> <u>university, an hour.</u> Take our INDEFINITE ARTICLES course to learn all about them.
