

## Opinion Verbs

There are lots of different verbs we can use to express our opinion.



When we use these verbs to express our opinion, we follow a special structure.





## Subject + Opinion Verb + Verb (ING)

I love watch<u>ing</u> TV
I like eat<u>ing</u> cheese
I don't like go<u>ing</u> to the cinema

\*You may see these verbs being used with the structure "to + infinitive". This is also correct, but it slightly changes the meaning. This means that the activity is a habit and it is normally used with a time phrase. For example, I like to watch TV at night. This sentence means you like the habit of watching TV at night. Most commonly, these verbs are used with the gerund (ING).
