*Regular verbs add ED to form the past simple, but there are many irregular verbs too (this is the second column in the irregular verb table)

To talk about one individual event that happened in the past and finished in the past. I went to Germany last summer.



NOW FUTURE

To talk about an event that happens repeatedly in the past at a regular interval. This does not happen now. I walked to school every morning.



A series of past events happening one after another. All events are finished now. I woke up, got dressed and brushed my teeth.



To talk about a duration of time in the past. This has finished now. I lived in Barcelona for 3 years.



To talk about something that has changed state from the past to the present (there are normally 2 parts). She was short as a child, but now she's tall.
