

Present Simple Questions

In the present simple tense, there are four different question structures. When creating a question in the present simple, you need to choose one of these structures.

What information do you want to know?

Yes/No Answer

If you only want to know "yes" or "no" as the answer to your question, you **do not need a question word.**

Information

If you want to know specific information (such as a place, a time, a person, an opinion), then **you need a specific question word.**

Is there a verb?

Yes

If there is a verb in the question (walk, dance, go etc..) then **we must use the auxiliary verb DO.**

No

If there is no other verb in the question, then **we must use the auxiliary verb BE.** The verb "be" is selfish and can't share a sentence with another verb.

So you need to answer all of these questions before you can create your question.

Is there a question word?

Yes

Is there a verb?

Yes

Auxiliary verb: do

When do you **have** English class?

No

Auxiliary verb: be

How old **are** you?

No

Is there a verb?

Yes

Auxiliary verb: do

Do you **like** dancing?

No

Auxiliary verb: be

Are you happy?
