

Should Common Mistakes

Learners in English often make mistakes when using the word "should". Let's take a look at the most common mistakes so you can avoid them yourself.

1

You should to visit the UK

Should is always followed by the bare infinitive verb and NEVER "to".

CORRECT: You should visit the UK

2

He should gets the plane

Should is always followed by the bare infinitive verb. We NEVER conjugate the second verb (get).

CORRECT: He should get the plane

3

She'd book the tickets

Should cannot be contracted in the affirmative form, it doesn't exist, so we always need to write SHOULD.

CORRECT: She should book the tickets
