*Last letter W *Last letter X *Stress on first syllable	+ ED	follow → followed relax → relaxed visit → visited
E rule	+ D	dance → danced
C rule	+ KED	picnic → picnicked
Y rule Consonant + Y Vowel + Y	Eliminate Y + IED + ED	study → studied play → played
