Cooking Verbs	Phonetic Transcription	Description
add	æd	To put into something else
bake	beɪk	To heat food without a direct flame, typically in an oven
blend	blɛnd	To mix something with a sharp blade
boil	bɔɪl	A liquid reaches 100°C and the liquid has big bubbles
burn	bɜ:n	To cook something too much that it is destroyed
caramelise	<u>kæ</u> rəməlaɪz	To make something sweet, usually by adding sugar
chop	tʃɒp	To use a knife quickly
crack	kræk	To break the shell of an egg
cut	kʌt	To use a knife slowly and with control
dissolve	dɪ <u>z</u> ɒlv	To convert something into a liquid form
drizzle	<u>drɪ</u> zl	To place a small stream of liquid over food
fry	fraɪ	To cook in a frying pan using fat (lard, butter, oil)
grill	grɪl	To heat food downwards
melt	mɛlt	To make a solid become liquid using heat
mix	mɪks	To combine two or more substances together in a container

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measure	<b>m</b> ɛʒə	To find the right quantity of something
pour	pɔː	A steady flow of a liquid
roast	rəʊst	To expose to heat for a long time
sift	sɪft	To use a sieve to get lumps out of a powder
simmer	<b>s</b> ɪmə	A liquid is very hot but with small bubbles
slice	slaɪs	To use a knife to cut a very thin piece
soften	<b>s</b> ɒfn	To make something soft
sprinkle	<b>spr</b> ɪŋkl	To add lots of little pieces (usually of a powder)
stir	stɜː	To move a substance by moving your hand and a spoon in a circular motion in a container
weigh	weɪ	To find the correct quantity (weight) of something
