

Past Simple v Present Perfect

The past simple is used to talk about a specific event in the past that has finished but the present perfect is used to talk about either an unfinished past event or a past event with no specified time.

Past Simple	Present Perfect
One single past event I went to Germany in summer	Life experience (no time) I have visited France before
A past duration I lived in Barcelona for 3 years	Past events impact present I've lost my wallet and I need it now
A repeated past event I drove to work every day	Recent past events We've just arrived home
A changed state She was short as a child but now she's tall	Change in state I have improved my English
Stative Verbs I wanted some chocolate yesterday	Stative Verbs I have known her for a long time
	Unfinished duration of time I haven't been to the cinema this year



LOOK OUT

- △ I knew her for 5 years (5 years finished in the past). I have known her for 5 years (1 started knowing her 5 years ago, I still know her today)
- △ She lived here for many years (she is dead). She has lived here for many years (she is alive and continues living here)
- △ I lost my wallet (simple finished event). I've lost my wallet and I need it now (past event with an impact on the present)
- △ I went to France in 2003 (finished time phrase). I've been to France before (no time phrase or an unfinished time phrase)
