(Personally) I think that ...

I feel that ...

In my (honest) opinion ...

In my opinion, we shouldn't invest any more money in space exploration.



My personal opinion is that ...

My personal opinion is that we should increase income tax.



In my (own personal) experience ...

In my experience, it is bad to lie.



As far as I'm concerned

As far as I'm concerned we should donate more money to charity.



Speaking for myself ...

Speaking for myself, war correspondence is one of the most dangerous jobs.



If you ask me ...

If you ask me, he's a horrible person!



From my point of view ...

From my point of view, you should fire him.



It seems to me that ...

It seems to me that he's only interested in hurting you!



What I mean is ...

What I mean is we should depend less on technology.



What I'm trying to say is ...

What I'm trying to say is we should spend more time outside in the fresh air.



Sometimes, we want to show a specific opinion that shows you **agree**. Let's look at some of these phrases.



- I agree (with you entirely)
- You're absolutely right!
- I think so too
- That's a good point
- I don't think so either
- I feel the same way
- That's a very valid point!
- I think what you said is true



Sometimes, we want to show a specific opinion that shows you **disagree**. Let's look at some of these phrases.



- I (am afraid I have to) disagree
- 🔪 I don't agree with you
 - On the contrary
- I see your point, but ...
- With all due respect ...
- No offense, but ...
- Let's agree to disagree
- I don't share your opinion/view
