

# Present Simple v Present Continuous Common Mistakes



Let's take a look at the typical mistakes that English learners make in the past simple and present perfect tenses.





I have received the letter on Monday

When we use a specific past time phrase that is finished, we must use the past simple tense.





I received the letter on Monday







When have you read that book?

Questions about a specific past time also require the past simple tense.





When did you read that book?





I worked here since 2001

Since tends to be used with the present perfect tense. This sentences refers to a time that is unfinished, the person continues to work here, so this requires the present perfect.



I have worked here since 2001
