


EVERETT — Hotel Indigo, Snohomish County's new waterfront hotel, opened its doors Tuesday and within hours had international fans.

"It's very beautiful, very nice," said Lam, who was strolling along the Pacific Rim Plaza on the hotel's waterfront side.













They were getting ready for bed when I got upstairs








It was 7pm and I was having dinner

At 5pm he was finishing work










It was raining outside, the trees were blowing in the wind, the wind was howling down the chimney and the house was shaking.







They were getting tall quickly


I was thinking about buying a new house

While is placed next to the past continuous part of the sentence

While I was cooking, he was watching TV







It means "at the same time"

While I was cooking, he was watching TV







We can also flip both parts of the sentence and it means exactly the same!

He was watching TV while he was cooking









While is often replaced with "whilst". They both have the same meaning.

He was watching TV whilst he was cooking








As is used in exactly the same way

As I was talking on my phone, it rang









Again, the sentences can be flipped around to say the same thing

My phone rang as I was talking





All must be followed by a time phrase

night
all day
morning







This time phrase can be used right at the beginning or right at the end of a phrase.

All night it was raining







This time phrase can be used right at the beginning or right at the end of a phrase.

It was raining all night





From ... to ... is a two-part phrase that requires two time phrases or two locations.

from A to B





from 2pm to 4pm from 21st to 24th from May to October from 2000 to 2010







It can go right at the beginning of a past continuous sentence.

From 2pm to 4pm I was watching TV.







It can also go right at the end of a past continuous sentence.

I was watching TV from 2pm to 4pm.





Through must always be followed by a time phrase.

through

the night the day
October







It has the same meaning as "the duration of" and can be used at the beginning of a sentence.

Through October, I was working with ABC.







Or at the end of a sentence.

I was working with ABC through October.







You may see this replaced with "throughout". They have the same meaning.

I was working with ABC <u>throughout</u> October.





For must always be followed by a time phrase.

2 weeks for 3 months 4 years





This time phrase must be a countable period of time (a number/length + noun).

2 weeks for 3 months 4 years







It can be placed at the beginning of a sentence.

For a long time, I was reading that book.







Or at the end of a sentence.

I was reading that book for a long time.
