



Accommodation

The most popular type of accommodation is a **hotel**. This is an establishment that provides a place to sleep as well as meals and numerous other services.



You can also stay in an **apartment**, also called a *flat*. An apartment will have a bedroom and bathroom, but also a living room/dining room and kitchen. You cook your own meals when staying here.





Resorts are also very popular for holiday accommodation. It's an entire establishment with numerous buildings that offer different services to the guests.

Villas tend to be private houses that are rented out for a holiday. They are self-catered, similar to an *apartment*, but the whole house is rented out.



You normally stay in a **cabin** when you go skiing. These are wooden houses in remote locations.





Cottages are very cute houses that are found in the countryside. They normally have traditional features on the house and can be quite old.

You could also stay in a **hostel**. This is low-cost accommodation where bedrooms and bathrooms are usually shared with other guests.



A **motel** is a hotel that is specifically designed for motorists who are travelling long distances and need to stop off. Typically, you enter each room from the central car park.



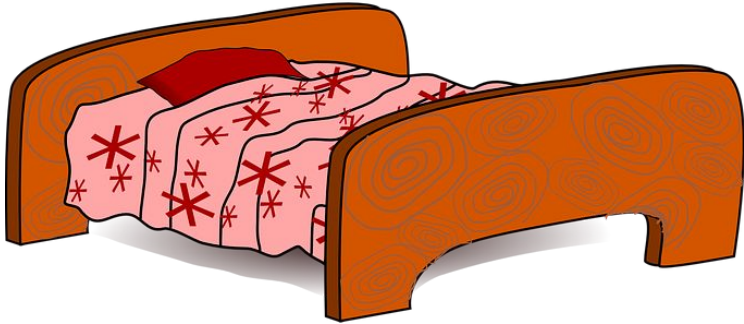


B&B stands for **bed and breakfast**. This accommodation provides the basics - a bed for the night and breakfast for the next morning. These tend to be small, family-run establishments.

No matter what type of accommodation you stay in, you need to know what type of room you want. Let's take a look!

single room

This is a room with a single
bed - for one person.



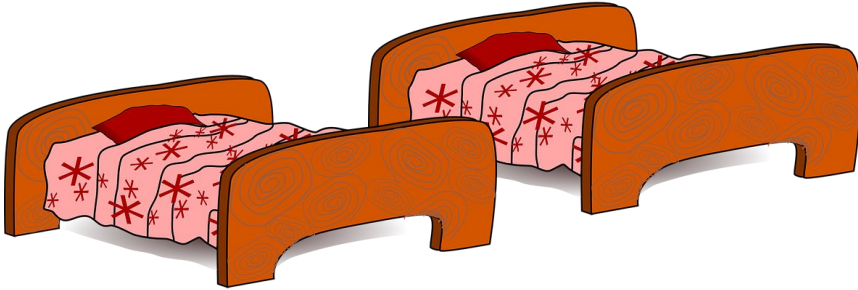
double room

This is a room with a double bed - for two people.



twin room

This is a room with with two single beds - for two people.



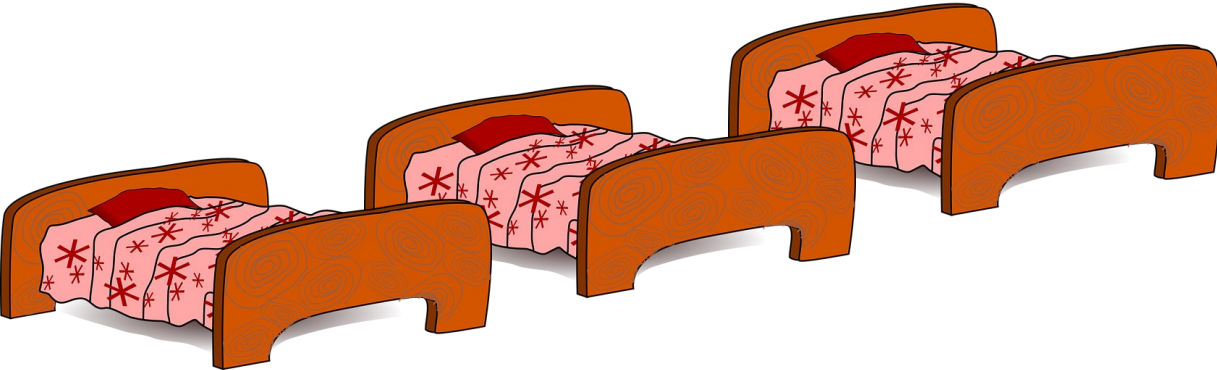
twin double room

This is a room with two double beds - for anything between two and four people.



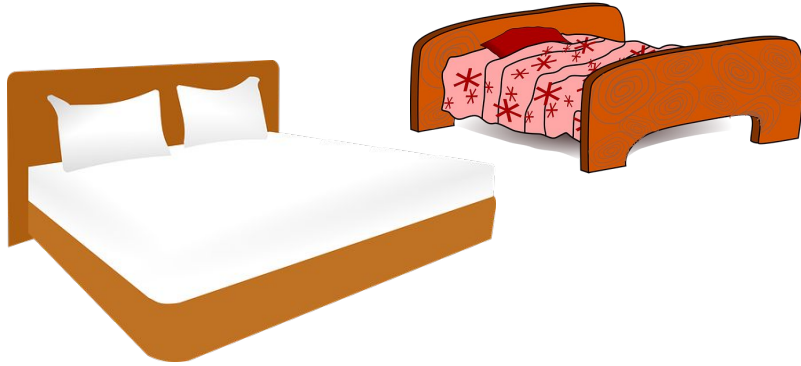
triple room

This is a room with three
single beds - for three
people.



family room

This is bigger than a standard room. You typically have a double bed and one extra single bed or a pull-out sofa.



suite



The suite is a very big room in a hotel that has a bathroom and bedroom but also a living/dining room and perhaps other rooms too.

private

The room is only
for you.



shared

The room is for you
and other people.
