



## Present Continuous Tense Interactive Worksheet

### Answers

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#### EXERCISE A

Complete the table below. In column 1, you should write the situation when the present continuous tense can be used. In column 2, you should write an example sentence and in column 3, you should write any additional notes provided in the video. The first situation has been given.

Situation	Example Sentence	Additional Notes
Right now	I am speaking	At the same time as speaking
Process	I'm studying to become a teacher	Temporary action over a long period of time
Future Events	My mum is visiting me on Saturday	Pre-planned event
Before and After	At 7am, I'm normally having a shower	Regular event at a specific time
Change in State	The children are growing up so quickly	Change from past to present
