

Error Correction **Answers**

Look at each sentence. They are all incorrect. Explain why the sentence is incorrect and write the correct sentence in the spaces provided.

1) I did really good in my exam.

EXPLANATION

**When describing a verb (do),
we need an adverb.**

CORRECT SENTENCE

I did really well in my exam.

2) I feel badly for her.

EXPLANATION

**Feel is a linking verb, which
requires an adjective.**

CORRECT SENTENCE

I feel bad for her.

3) She appeared so sadly.

EXPLANATION

**Appear is a linking verb, which
requires an adjective.**

CORRECT SENTENCE

She appeared so sad.

4) I run much quicker than my younger brothers.

EXPLANATION

Run is a verb, so we need an adverb to describe this. In this case, we're using the comparative form.

CORRECT SENTENCE

I run much more quickly than my younger brothers

5) I work as hardly as my colleagues.

EXPLANATION

Hard is an irregular adverb that is the same in adjective and adverb form (hard).

CORRECT SENTENCE

I work as hard as my colleagues.

6) I wish I could speak as fluent as her in English.

EXPLANATION

When describing a verb (speak), we require an adverb. In this case, we are using the comparative adverb form.

CORRECT SENTENCE

I wish I could speak as fluently as her in English.

7) She played the match so bad today!

EXPLANATION

When describing a verb (play), we need an adverb.

CORRECT SENTENCE

She played the match so badly today.
