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EXERCISE A: Fill in the table with information about zero quantity.

Noun Type	Example Sentence	Verb (+ / -)	Quantifier	Short Form
Singular Countable Noun (A)	<i>There isn't a banana in the fridge</i>	-	a	none
Singular Countable Noun (An)	<i>There isn't an apple in the fridge</i>	-	an	none
Plural Countable Noun	<i>There aren't any tomatoes in the fridge</i>	-	any	none
	<i>There are no tomatoes in the fridge</i>	+	no	none
Uncountable Noun	<i>There isn't any yoghurt in the fridge</i>	-	any	none
	<i>There is no yoghurt in the fridge</i>	+	no	none
