adventure	əd <u>v</u> ɛntʃə	<i>Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade</i>	A film where travel and exploration are central themes
action	<u>æ</u> kʃən	<i>The Dark Knight</i>	A film that is exciting with lots of events happening
animation	æni <u>m</u> eɪʃən	<i>Frozen</i>	A film that uses drawings created on technology
cartoon	kɑ: <u>t</u> u:n	<i>Toy Story</i>	A film that uses animation techniques
comedy	<u>k</u> ɒmɪdi	<i>Elf</i>	A film where humour is important
crime	kraɪm	<i>Fast and Furious</i>	A film where a crime takes place
documentary	dɒkju <u>m</u> ɛntəri	<i>Senna</i>	A factual film based on real events
drama	<u>d</u> rɑ:mə	<i>Dunkirk</i> <i>(historical drama)</i>	A more serious film. You can have different types of drama too - historical drama, crime drama, political drama
family film	<u>f</u> æmɪli fɪlm	<i>Mary Poppins</i>	A film where children growing up is the central theme

horror	<u>h</u> ɒrə	<i>The Conjuring</i>	A film that tries to scare the viewer
melodrama	<u>m</u> ɛləʊdrɑ:mə	<i>The Enigma of Kaspar Hauser</i>	A very dramatic film with big events and strong characters
musical	<u>m</u> ju:zɪkəl	<i>The Greatest Showman</i>	A film with lots of music and songs
terror	<u>t</u> ɛrə	<i>Us</i>	A film that makes the audience scared about what's about to happen
thriller	<u>θ</u> rɪlə	<i>About Elly</i>	A film with an exciting story that creates suspense
science fiction (sci-fi)	<u>s</u> aɪəns <u>f</u> ɪkʃən	<i>Star Wars</i>	A film with imaginary situations as a result of science or technology
romantic comedy (romcom)	rəʊ <u>m</u> æntɪk kɒmɪdi	<i>Bridget Jones' Diary</i>	A film with a love story and with jokes
war	wɔ:	<i>1917</i>	A film about conflict
western	<u>w</u> ɛstən	<i>The Good, The Bad and The Ugly</i>	A film about cowboys in western North America
zombie	<u>z</u> ɒmbi	<i>Shaun of the Dead</i>	A film that has zombies - people who return to life after they die
