# Forms

The present perfect and the present perfect continuous tenses have different forms.  
Let's review them.

# Forms

## AFFIRMATIVE

Present Perfect	Present Perfect Continuous
<p>I have walked You have walked He has walked She has walked It has walked We have walked They have walked</p>	<p>I have been walking You have been walking He has been walking She has been walking It has been walking We have been walking They have been walking</p>

# Forms

## NEGATIVE

Present Perfect	Present Perfect Continuous
I haven't walked You haven't walked He hasn't walked She hasn't walked It hasn't walked We haven't walked They haven't walked	I haven't been walking You haven't been walking He hasn't been walking She hasn't been walking It hasn't been walking We haven't been walking They haven't been walking

Yes, you have	No, you haven't	Yes, you have	No, you haven't
Yes, he has	No, he hasn't	Yes, he has	No, he hasn't
Yes, she has	No, she hasn't	Yes, she has	No, she hasn't
Yes, it has	No, it hasn't	Yes, it has	No, it hasn't
Yes, we have	No, we haven't	Yes, we have	No, we haven't
Yes, they have	No, they haven't	Yes, they have	No, they haven't
