

Present Perfect v Present Perfect Continuous Forms



The present perfect and the present perfect continuous tenses have different forms.

Let's review them.



AFFIRMATIVE

Present Perfect	Present Perfect Continuous	
I have walked	I have been walking	
You have walked	You have been walking	
He has walked	He has been walking	
She has walked	She has been walking	
It has walked	It has been walking	
We have walked	We have been walking	
They have walked	They have been walking	



NEGATIVE

Present Perfect	Present Perfect Continuous	
I haven't walked	I haven't been walking	
You haven't walked	You haven't been walking	
He hasn't walked	He hasn't been walking	
She hasn't walked	She hasn't been walking	
It hasn't walked	It hasn't been walking	
We haven't walked	We haven't been walking	
They haven't walked	They haven't been walking
