

Articles Pronunciation

The indefinite articles are a, an and some. We can pronounce these "perfectly" by using the big open sounds.

a an /æ// /æ//

an /s**\m**/



But we can be very lazy in English and, sometimes, use a "weak form" instead. Here, we replace the big vowels with the schwa sound.

a an an /ə/ /ən/ /sʌm/



When we use the articles a and an, we can also introduce connected speech and try to blend them into the words either side.

I have<u>apen</u> and<u>apencil</u>





The definite article can be pronounced in two different ways. The pronunciation depends on the first sound of the following word.

the the /ði:/



We use the short vowel pronunciation when the following word starts with a consonant sound.

the
/ðə/

The dog
The cat
The bird



We use the long vowel pronunciation when the following word starts with a vowel sound.

the
/ði:/

The elephant
The alligator
The insect
