To show

*What is on TV?*

# Phrasal Verbs for Cinema

**to come out**

intransitive

To be released

*The sequel has just come out!*

# Phrasal Verbs for Cinema

**to be about**

intransitive

To have a storyline

*What is the film about?*

# Phrasal Verbs for Cinema

## To fall in love with

transitive - inseparable

To have strong loving feelings

*I fell in love my boyfriend when I was 18*

# Phrasal Verbs for Cinema

## To eat up

transitive - separable

To eat entirely

*You need to eat it all up!*

# Phrasal Verbs for Cinema

To sit back

intransitive

To relax

*Let's sit back this afternoon*



# Phrasal Verbs for Cinema

**To nod off**

intransitive

To briefly sleep

*Please don't nod off!*

# Phrasal Verbs for Cinema

## To sleep through

transitive - inseparable

To sleep with noise in the background

*We slept through the storm*

# Phrasal Verbs for Cinema

**To walk out**

intransitive

To leave a place

*Why did you walk out?*
