intransitive

To be fashionable and in style

This colour is really in this season.



to be out

intransitive

to be not fashionable and out of style

This colour is really out this season.



to have on

transitive - separable

to be wearing

I have a dress on.



to dress up

intransitive

to wear formal and fancy clothing

I'll dress up for the party tonight.



to put on

transitive - separable

to place on your body

Shall I put a skirt on?



to dress down

intransitive

to wear informal and comfortable clothing

I'll dress down for the family event.



to try on

transitive - separable

to put some clothing on your body to check the size/fit

Can you try this blouse on?



to let in

transitive - separable

to change the size of some clothing, making it smaller

We need to let this top in.



to let out

transitive - separable

to change the size of some clothing, making it bigger

I'm pregnant now, can we let this dress out a bit?



to take up

transitive - separable

to change the size of some clothing, making it shorter

These trousers are too long, can you taken them up?



to take down

transitive - separable

to change the size of some clothing, making it longer

They're too short - can you take them down?
