


Present Perfect Continuous Mistakes



There are three common mistakes that English learners make in the present perfect continuous tense. Let's review them, so you can avoid these mistakes!





We've been only living here for a few years

Make sure you use the keywords in this tense in the correct position. **Only** should be in between "have" and "been".



We've been only living here for a few years

We've only been living here for a few years





We have been working since 5 years



We have been working since 5 years

Since is used with a specific past time, whilst for is used with a period of time.



We have been working since 5 years

We have been working for 5 years





She has been swiming this morning



She has been swiming this morning

There are lots of spelling changes with the present participle, so make sure you learn them all!

She has been swi<u>m</u>ming this morning
