3) Main story events

- You should have seen/heard/been there
- ➡ To top it all off ...
- The strange/funny thing was ...
- Can you imagine my surprise when ...
- By the time I'd realised what had happened ...
- ➡ There I was ...





4) Ending

- To cut a long story short
- So in the end what happened was ...
- It seems quite funny now, but it didn't at the time ...
- Anyway, it turned out well in the end
- ightharpoonup The long and the short of it ..
