An acre of	ən <u>ə</u> kər ðv	(ac) A partitive measure for area. Equivalent to 4,046.86 m ²	<i>We just bought a beautiful acre of land.</i>	
An array of Laptops, phones	ən ə <u>r</u> eɪ ðv	A very large collection of the same object.	<i>She has an array of technology.</i>	
An article of faith	ən <u>ɑ</u> :tɪkl ðv	One specific part within an entire thing. This is normally used for legal documents.	<i>An article of faith I truly believe in is treating each other kindly.</i>

A blob of glue, water	ə blɒb ðv	An uneven, misshapen quantity of something, normally a paste.	<i>I just need a blob of glue to stick this bead down.</i>	
A cake of soap	ə keɪk ðv	A bar. A rectangular shape of a solid object.	<i>I'll just put this cake of soap next to the sink.</i>	
A dash of lemonade, water	ə dæʃ ðv	A very small quantity, normally a liquid.	<i>Can you just add a dash of soda to my drink?</i>	
A feeling of anger, sorrow,	ə <u>fi:lɪŋ</u> ðv	To become aware of an emotion or sensation.	<i>I had a deep feeling of sorrow when my dog passed away.</i>	
A flask of tea, whiskey	ə flɑ:sk ðv	A metal container that is very thin and stores liquid. Normally it keeps a liquid very hot or very cold.	<i>I'd like a flask of tea to take on our walk in the countryside.</i>	
A fleet of ships	ə fli:t ðv	A large group of ships under the command of one captain.	<i>He is the captain of this fleet of ships.</i>	
A fluid ounce of	ə <u>flu:ɪd</u> aʊns ðv	(fl oz) A partitive of measure for volume. Equivalent to 29.57 millilitres.	<i>We need 2 fluid ounces of water in this mixture.</i>

A flurry of excitement, snow	ə flʌ ri ðv	A sudden and spontaneous activity or feeling.	<i>As soon as I left the office, there was a flurry of activity.</i>	
A foot of	ə fʊt ðv	(ft) A partitive measure for distance. Equivalent to 30.48 centimetres.	<i>There was a foot of snow when I woke up in the morning.</i>	
A glimmer of happiness, hope	ə ɡlɪ mər ðv	A small possibility of something.	<i>When we won the legal case, people had a glimmer of hope for a better future.</i>	
A gust of wind	ə ɡʌst ðv	A sudden and intense push of wind.	<i>A gust of wind broke my umbrella.</i>	
A hectare of	ə hektə :r ðv	(ha) A partitive measure for an area of 100m ² .	<i>There is a beautiful hectare of land on the coast that we just bought.</i>	
A herd of cattle	ə hɜ:d ðv	A group of animals that travel together. Usually cattle.	<i>The herd of cattle were crossing the road.</i>	
An inch of	ən ɪnʃ ðv	(in) A partitive measure for distance. Equivalent to 2.54 centimetres.	<i>I'd like you to cut 2 inches of my hair off.</i>

A knob of butter, lard	ə nɒb ðv	An uneven and misshapen piece of a solid.	Add a knob of butter to the pan.	
A lock of hair	ə lɒk ðv	An individual strand of hair.	I have just one brown lock of hair.	
An ounce of	ən aʊns ðv	(oz) A partitive measure for weight. Equivalent to 28.53 grams.	We need an ounce of flour.	
A pack of lies, wolves	ə pæk ðv	A collection of the same things all together.	She told me a pack of lies yesterday. I know she didn't do it.	
A pair of earmuffs, goggles	ə peər ðv	Two things normally used together.	I need a new pair of goggles to go swimming. My last pair are broken.	
A pearl of wisdom	ə pɜ:l ðv	A very useful piece of advice.	My grandmother has passed on her pearls of wisdom.

A pound of	ə paʊnd ɒv	(lb) A partitive measure for weight. Equivalent to 453.59 grams.	<i>I'd only like a pound of sausages for the party tonight.</i>	
A scrap of difference, food	ə skræp ɒv	A very small quantity, normally unwanted.	<i>There was only a scrap of food left.</i>	
A shred of evidence	ə ʃrɛd ɒv	A very small quantity.	<i>We couldn't find a shred of evidence to support his innocence.</i>	
A six-pack of beer, lager	ə sɪks -pæk ɒv	A quantity of six of the same thing, all in one container.	<i>Shall we buy a six-pack of beer?</i>	
A slab of concrete, wood	ə slæb ɒv	A solid material in an oblong shape. This is normally thick and wide.	<i>We need to add a slab of concrete here, so the children don't fall down the hole.</i>	
A snatch of conversation	ə snætʃ ɒv	A very small quantity of speech.	<i>I only heard a snatch of their conversation, but I think she's getting married.</i>	
A speck of dust, paint	ə spɛk ɒv	A very small, but visible, mark.	<i>You have a speck of paint on your jacket.</i>

A spell of thunder, work	ə spɛl ðv	A specific period of time that is obvious because one event constantly happens during this time.	<i>We had a very busy spell of work this month.</i>	
A splinter of wood	ə <u>splɪ</u> ntər ðv	A small sharp piece of wood that has broken away from the main piece of wood.	<i>I have a splinter of wood in my finger.</i>	
A spot of bother, trouble	ə spɒt ðv	A short period of time.	<i>She'll be in a spot of trouble if she doesn't close this contract.</i>	
A squirt of liquid, water	ə skwɜ:t ðv	A very thin and high-pressure stream of liquid in one direction.	<i>Just add a squirt of washing up liquid to the bowl and leave it to soak.</i>	
A stone of	ə stəʊn ðv	(st) A partitive measure for weight. Equivalent to 6.35 kilograms.	<i>I'm holding 2 stones of meat.</i>	
A stroke of genius, luck	ə strəʊk ðv	An unexpected and spontaneous event.	<i>That idea was a stroke of genius! Well done!</i>	
A ton of	ə tʌn ðv	(t) A partitive of measure for weight of 1000kg.	<i>We need a ton of stones to cover this area.</i>

A touch of <i>irony, sadness</i>	ə tʌtʃ ðv	A very small effect, normally emotional.	<i>There was a touch of sadness to our farewell. We didn't know if we would ever see each other again.</i>	
A trace of <i>cynicism, snow</i>	ə treɪs ðv	A very small amount.	<i>There was only a trace of snow on the ground, so we couldn't build a snowman.</i>	
A yard of	ə jɑ:d ðv	(yd) A partitive measure for distance. Equivalent to 0.91 metres.	<i>We need a yard of string to tie to these posts.</i>
