Top Tips

- Look at the picture in detail first before describing it
- Remember to describe pictures in the present continuous tense
- Be methodical in your description, following the structure set out below.

Are there people?

- What are the people doing? Do you know who it is?
- What are they wearing?
- What is their physical appearance?
- What are their emotions?
- Is the main subject of the picture? Why/not?

Are there objects?

- What object can you see?
- Describe the shape, style, formation, use, material.

Are there animals?

- What is the animal?
- What does it look like describe the physical traits..
- What is the emotion of the animal?

Is it a place?

- Where is the picture?
- What can you see in the background/foreground?
- What is the atmosphere/feeling of the place?

What do you think?

- What is this image telling you? What are the meanings behind the image?
- Do you like/dislike the image? Why?



Parts of the Picture

- In the picture
- In the background/ foreground/ distance
- At the top/ at the bottom
- On the right-hand side/ on the left-hand side
- In the bottom left-hand corner / in the top right-hand corner
- Below
