



Past Perfect Continuous

The past perfect continuous tense is used to talk about the first of two past events that have both finished. There is often a slight overlap between the two events.

⇒ Keywords include when, since, for, before and after.

Affirmative	Negative	Question
I had been walking	I hadn't been walking	Had I been walking?
You had been walking	You hadn't been walking	Had you been walking?
He had been walking	He hadn't been walking	Had he been walking?
She had been walking	She hadn't been walking	Had she been walking?
It had been walking	It hadn't been walking	Had it been walking?
We had been walking	We hadn't been walking	Had we been walking?
They had been walking	They hadn't been walking	Had they been walking?
