EXERCISE A

What are the similarities between the verbs will and shall?

Both verbs are modal verbs (so no “to” after the word, must be followed by an infinitive and are the same for all subjects). Both verbs represent future forms.

EXERCISE B

Fill in the table with the correct forms of the verb will.
