transitive - inseparable

To show interest in somebody and flatter them

I love it when he flirts with me.



# to chat up

transitive - inseparable

To converse with somebody while flirting

It's so hard to chat somebody up.



#### to make out

intransitive

To kiss

We made out on the date.



#### to fall for

transitive - inseparable

To have strong feelings and fall in love with

I'm really falling for her.



# to go out with

transitive - inseparable

To date

I'm going out with Sam.



#### to move in

intransitive

To move to a new house and live with somebody

We moved in together last year.



# to fall apart

intransitive

To lose interest in something and start failing

Our relationship started falling apart



to split up

intransitive

To end a relationship

They keep splitting up!



# to live together

intransitive

To live in the same place

My husband and I live together.



# to break up

intransitive

To end a relationship

I can't believe they broke up.
